This ocean-themed destination immerses you in Caribbean life and the myths of Atlantis. This packet explains how to sign up for the convention. We'll also share a dozen reasons you will want to start packing your bags today.

As a bonus, we'll give you a session-free day to play at Atlantis.

Call it our 60th birthday gift to you. No pressure to leave or stay. You have the power to choose: On Monday, stay with your team to play or head back to apply all you've learned. If you stay, we're offering a special meal plan to minimize your food costs.

Register

All registration takes place on Intercom. Click on the convention banner labeled **Mile Marker 60** to register, set up your flights and check for updates.

Register by Oct. 31 for the best package rates. Packages based on double occupancy cost \$999 per person. Single occupancy cost \$1,862. If you'd like, we'll find a roommate so you can get a double package price. After Oct. 31, package rates increase \$50 per person.

There is no discount on package rates if you stay fewer than five nights. Please go to the registration form if you would like to sign up for additional nights.

New this year, third and fourth persons over the age of 17 cost \$68 per person per night to cover foreign taxes and fees.



Convention Packages

A full convention package includes:

- Accommodations for five nights
- Food, entertainment and events on the convention schedule (excluding Optional Monday Meal Plan, see next page)
- Shuttle service between Atlantis and Lynden Pindling International Airport for Thursday, June 14 (see Flight Arrangements for exclusions) and Monday, June 18 or Tuesday, June 19
- Hotel and airport baggage handling

Children's Packages

Children's packages include meals and events listed on the agenda, except the Optional Monday Meal Plan. Packages for children 6 to 17 years old cost \$400. Children ages 5 and younger are free. Additional costs may apply if you request extra bedding. You can arrange in-room babysitting through the concierge with advance notice.

The fire code limits the number of people per room to four. Infants are exempt.



Optional Monday Meal Plans

If you stay through Tuesday, you may want to take advantage of the Optional Monday Meal Plan: Lunch and dinner for adults and children ages 6 and older costs \$100 per person. Lunch and dinner for children ages 5 and younger are free.



Registration Change Fee

A change fee of \$50 will be charged per registration adjustment made after March 2, 2012.

Cancellations and Penalties

We block hotel rooms in advance. Penalties apply if you cancel registrations after Jan. 12, 2012. If you cancel, you must cancel your air travel through your airline of choice. Your airline may charge other cancellation or change fees.

Cancellation Dates: Jan. 13 – Feb. 16

Your cost: 50% of the hotel room cost

Cancellation Dates: Feb. 17 – March 15

Your cost: 50% of the convention package cost

Cancellation Dates: March 16 – June 19

Your cost: 100% of the convention package cost

CONVENTION FUNDING PLANS

To help you get to Mile Marker 60, we've created the following ways to earn packages:

IBSA Contribution Fund

This fund allows you to earn one convention package for every 15,140 units purchased in calendar year 2011. Packages only go to distributors and their spouses or team members and their spouses. Every unit counts. In fact, every unit purchased is applied toward a qualified package.

Distributor Convention Savings Account

This savings account accumulates 10 cents per unit over-bill, plus interest. After the account has paid all convention charges, you can choose to roll over any remaining balance for the next convention or cash it out.

TRAVEL PLANS

Passports

Plan ahead. This is an international trip, and all travelers must have passports. U.S. citizens ordering new passports should plan for at least two months' processing. U.S. citizens, visit Intercom for a government link for information about passport applications. For all international distributors and employees, check with your government for any international travel requirements and to obtain appropriate travel documents.

Flight Arrangements

Visit the travel form on Intercom to make online flight requests and our travel desk will book your flights. If we book your air travel, we'll also arrange transportation between Lynden Pindling International Airport and Atlantis June 14, June 18 and June 19. If you prefer to make reservations yourself, you may use discount code **A2462AY** to get discounted fares with American Airlines. However, we cannot cover transportation to and from the hotel. Due to limited transportation on the island, there are no exceptions this year.



Ticketing

For your convenience and because of airline regulations, you'll travel with electronic tickets to Nassau, Bahamas. Boarding passes will not be sent to you. All you'll need is a confirmation number.

Car Rental Arrangements

You can arrange for a rental car through the travel desk. Remember to confirm your reservations two weeks before your travel date. If you rent a car, prepare for parking costs. Valet parking costs \$10 per vehicle per day.

Guests may also use the complimentary shuttle, which runs every 30 minutes, to get around the resort. With everything Atlantis offers, it is not likely you'll want to leave the property.



ADVENTURES IN ATLANTIS

Water Adventures

Celebrating Mile Marker 60 in Atlantis will allow you to explore an amazing waterscape. Access to the resort's Aquaventure Waterpark and the marine habitats is free for guests.

Challenge yourself to explore every water adventure. Some require additional fees.

Highlights in Atlantis include:

- Visit Nassau's marine habitats to waterslide through the sharks, snorkel through ruins or ride the dolphins during the resort's signature Dolphin Push.
- Scuba certified? Explore a reef, dive the Tongue-of-the-Ocean wall or investigate a sunken ship. Not certified? Enjoy a pool-based scuba lesson and opt for an ocean dive on the same day.



- Rock climbing, water slides and river rides: Welcome to 141-acre Aquaventure Water Park. Scream down the front of a Mayan temple on your favorite floatie, drift along a mile-long river ride or simply do whatever floats your boat.
- Can't snorkel or even swim? Dive right in with "snuba," a form of snorkeling with floating air-tanks.
- Take a swim in any of 11 themed pools – including three kid pools – or savor seven acres of beach line on the powder-soft sands of Paradise Lagoon.



Explore Paradise Island

If H₂O's not your thing, tickle your itinerary with a few of these activities at the resort. Some events have admission costs and rental fees. Remember prices can fluctuate.

- Treat yourself at the Fountain-of-Youth-themed Mandara Spa, offering body treatments, barber services and massage therapy. Menus of services are available online.

- Explore international cuisine across the resort's 21 restaurants, offering fine dining, casual eats and cafés.
- Test your handicap on the Ocean Club Golf Course, an 18-hole championship course overlooking the Bahamian coastline. Luckily, the golf package comes with two sleeves of balls.
- Try the 90 table games or one of the 850 slot machines at the casino.
- Tour the lost city of Atlantis at The Dig, a marine habitat featuring tropical fish, piranhas and costumed performer, Hannah Mermaid.
- Stop by Joker's Wild Comedy Club for nightly acts or catch a concert at Atlantis LIVE. Past performers include Jerry Seinfeld, Katy Perry, Sheryl Crow and Michael Jackson.
- Peruse world-class shopping at the Crystal Court or Marina Village for souvenirs, vacation supplies or clothes. Nothing makes a tropical-print shirt more authentic than buying it in the Bahamas.
